ii) Further requirement of Prison staff (1000 personnel)

The Director General, Pakistan Rangers Sindh Karachi vide letter No.0108/GS(Ops)/4681 dated 10.11.2014 addressed to the Honourable Minister for Prisons with copy to the undersigned and others has reported that in the backdrop of the Central Prison Karachi tunnel incident, security audit of Central Prison Hyderabad and Central Prison Sukkur was carried out by Rangers to find out the grey areas / weakness. The detailed analysis reveals few lapses which need immediate attention of concerned authorities. Besides other recommendations the Director General has recommended to enhance the strength of Prisons / District Police Personnel at both the Prisons. A proposal was made to the Government of Sindh, Home Department Karachi for creation of 1000 posts as Special Prison Security Force (SPSF). On creation of demanded posts the personnel will be employed for strengthen the security of Sindh Prisons.

iii) Auxiliary Agencies

The Sindh Prisons has no sufficient security staff and receiving serious security threats by the terrorist / banned organization. In order to strengthen the security of the Prisons, other law enforcement agencies are deployed at the Prisons as per details given below: -

iv) <u>Installation of Jammers</u>

Under the directions of Honourable High Court of Sindh passed in C.P.No.2170, the Government of Sindh Finance Department had allocated funds amounting to Rs.88.072 (M) placed at the disposal of Government of Sindh, Home Department Karachi against 7 units (one unit consists 2 jammers) at the rate of Rs.4.41 (M) per jammer including yearly maintenance charges. Total cost of 7 units is Rs.30.934 (M) has been installed at Central Prison Karachi by M/s National Radio & Telecommunication Corporation (NRTC) Ministry of Defense Production, Government of Pakistan.

Security Gadgets

The activities of the prisoners and the visitors were not properly checked and the existing security gadgets were either not as per requirement of the day or non-functional due to which proper security checking was not carried out. Therefore the Government of Sindh was requested for allocation of funds for procurement of the security gadgets. The Government of Sindh allocated an amount of Rs.31.50 million for the purpose. The following security gadgets were purchased in the year 2014 and supplied to the prisons for security surveillance.
